Lexington "Mask To Stay" Policy



Direct contacts **in a school environment**, regardless of vaccination or masking status, may remain in the classroom environment if they:

Wear a mask **for 10 days** after their last date of exposure.

Self-monitor, or parent-monitor, for symptoms of COVID-19.

<u>Isolate and get tested</u> if they start to experience symptoms associated with COVID-19 (regardless of level of severity).

Students and staff may discontinue these quarantine procedures after 7 days — **if they meet two basic criteria**: **1** – they don't develop symptoms, and **2** – they test negative between days 5-7.

The tests can be either the genetic PCR coronavirus test or the antigen test. But it must be proctored or observed. The students would have to go to the doctor, a pharmacy or other test provider.

Lexington "Test to Play" Policy

Asymptomatic contacts **in a school environment** may continue to participate in extracurricular activities if they:



Wear a mask when able. This includes wearing a mask during transportation, such as traveling on a team bus to and from games; while in locker rooms; while sitting or standing on the sidelines; and any time the mask will not interfere with breathing, the activity in which they are participating, or create a safety hazard.

Test on initial notification of exposure to COVID-19.

Test again between days 5-7 following exposure to COVID-19. If they are negative at this time, they will test out of quarantine after day 7 and can resume normal activities.

Same-day testing is encouraged for athletic competitions where there is the potential of school-to-school exposure.

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UNVACCINATED STUDENTS

Children exposed to COVID-19 in the classroom or during a school-related extracurricular activity.

Quarantine is **NOT** required if they do not have symptoms AND they do the following, regardless of vaccination status:

- Wear a mask for <u>10 days</u> after their last date of exposure
 - Your child may discontinue wearing a mask after day 7 if they do not have symptoms AND they have tested negative 5-7 days after their last date of exposure.*
 - If your child chooses not to wear a mask at school, they must quarantine at home for 10 days after their last date of exposure.
- Monitor for symptoms for 10 days after their last date of exposure

VACCINATED STUDENTS

If your child is **fully vaccinated**, they <u>do not</u> need to quarantine; however, you should still monitor them for symptoms of COVID-19 for 14 days following their last exposure. Your child should be tested for COVID-19 if they develop symptoms during the monitoring period. The CDC recommends vaccinated direct contacts wear a mask while indoors for 10 days following their last exposure, or until they receive a negative COVID-19 test result (the test should not be done until it has been 5-7 days since their last exposure).

The CDC recommends vaccinated direct contacts be tested for COVID-19 after it has been at least 5-7 days since their last exposure, even if they are symptom-free.

RECENTLY RECOVERED STUDENTS

If your child has a documented positive viral (PCR or antigen) test result from within the previous three months, they do not need to quarantine or test. In order for the result to be considered documented, it must have been reported to Richland Public Health.

^{*}MUST use a viral (PCR or antigen) COVID-19 test. If using an athome test, the test MUST be proctored/observed by someone during a virtual visit.
