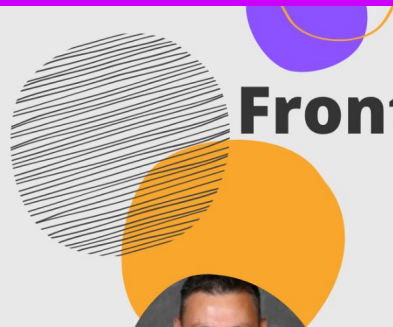

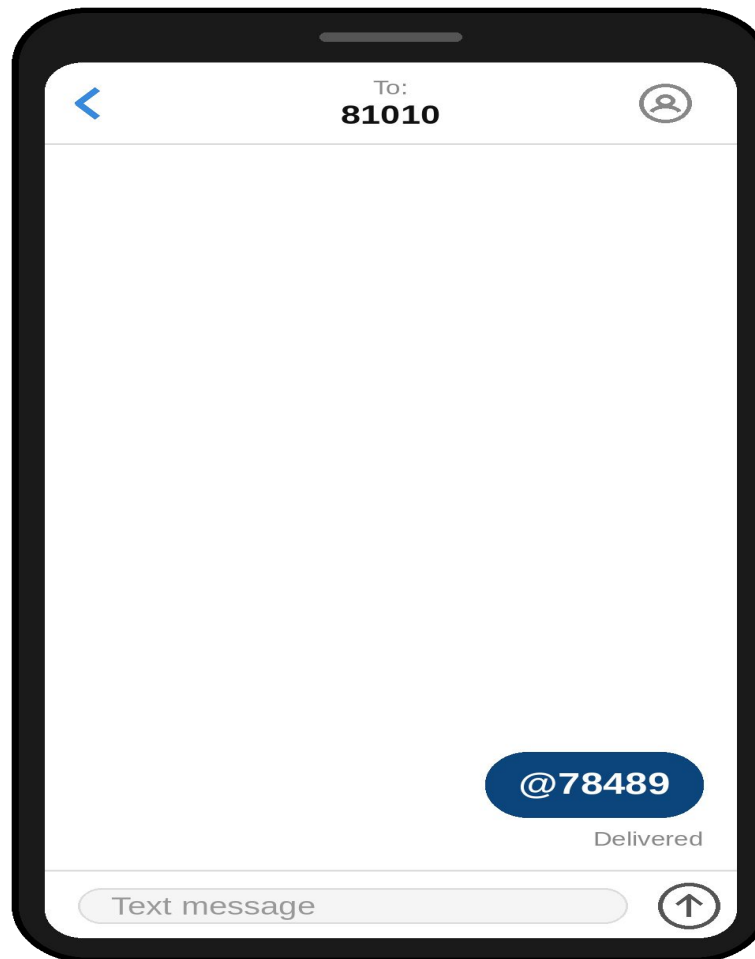
District Communication

- Please make sure Final Forms are completed **ASAP**
- Forms need updated yearly
- Student drivers will need to fill out the parking forms and pick up a parking tag
- Due to large number of students on the busses, bus passes will not be granted

Expectations

- We expect you to be here everyday, giving your best effort
- We expect you to treat each other with respect and do the same with your teachers and the rest of our staff.
- We expect you to challenge yourselves and each other.

Morning Arrival

- Buses will enter from Championship Lane and drop students off in front of the school in the bus loop
- Students can be dropped off at the front of the high school using the **drop-off loop**
(PLEASE STAY OUT OF THE BUS LOOP)
- Students should **not** be dropped off before 7am
- Breakfast begins at 7am

Morning Arrival

- Students are expected to behave properly while riding the school bus
- Driving to school is a privilege which can be revoked
- When students arrive, they are permitted to roam the building but are limited to the cafeteria and academic portions of the building where staff can supervise students
- Students are **not** permitted on the JH side of the building without administrator permission

Morning Arrival

- The ‘Warning Bell’ rings at 7:35
 - Head to class
 - Remove earbuds
 - Remove headphones
 - Remove hoods,...

- The “Tardy Bell” rings at 7:40
 - You need to be in class, in your seat and ready to learn **before** the bell rings

Afternoon Dismissal

- Students are dismissed at 2:34 p.m. and can be picked up using the same loop as the morning
- Staff, seniors, and students taking CCP classes off campus are only permitted to park in the main parking lot - the first three rows are for staff
- All other drivers may park in the parking lot across Clever Lane (All drivers must have a parking permit)

Student Handbook

- The student handbook is posted online and a hard copy can be found in the main office, student services and posted in the cafeteria
- Recommend students and parents to look it over
- Topics include academic expectations, discipline procedures, cell phone policy, dress code, athletic eligibility requirements, attendance procedures, intervention assistance, and much more...

Lockers

- Lockers are not required
- You can reserve a locker - See Ms. Noland in the Student Services office
- You are responsible for what you and/or your friends put in your locker
- Do not share your locker or locker code with anyone else
- Be respectful of others near your locker

Lunch / Advisory

- There are two different lunch periods at the high school and they are **11:56-12:26 & 12:30-1:00**
- The period you are not in lunch will be your advisory period
- If your advisory is on the first floor, you will have the first lunch and if your advisory is on the second floor, you will have the second lunch

What is Advisory?

- Advisory is every day for 30 minutes
- Serves as a time for students to collaborate, participate in clubs, get extra academic support and more
- Students have an advisory teacher that also provides support and helps monitor their progress on a weekly basis

Pay To Participate

- High School & Junior High Athletics, Cheerleading & Marching Band
- **High School: \$100.00 & Junior High School: \$50.00**
- **Fall Fee Due Dates:** Tomorrow (Aug 14th)
- **Winter & Spring Due Dates:** No later than one week prior to the official first day of practice
- **Payment Methods:** Cash or Check - Tonight or During School Hours OR PaySchools (Credit Card)
- *Winter Athletes: DO NOT PAY UNTIL THE END OF SEPT.
- *Spring Athletes: DO NOT PAY UNTIL THE END OF JAN.

Final Forms

- Many of you are familiar with Final Forms because of athletics
- The district has moved to this process for all forms in the district
- There are computers available in the cafeteria for you to complete tonight if you choose
- Directions are also posted on the school website under **Parents and Students**
- Be sure to complete/update so that we have the most accurate information
- The only form that you will need to fill out and send in anymore will be for free/reduced lunch

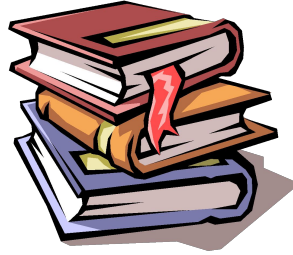
Academic Eligibility

- Grades 9-12 must be currently enrolled
- Must have passed a minimum of five (5) one credit courses or the equivalent in the previous grading period
- Remember that 'boys/girls phys ed' is only worth $\frac{1}{4}$ credit & **DOES NOT** count towards the five class requirement
- It's your responsibility to make sure your have enough classes and are in good standing
- Questions or concerns, see your counselor or Mr. Eichorn

Attending Events

- Students may purchase a fall athletic pass for \$35
- Gets you into all home sporting events at Lexington High School and Junior High
- Appropriate behavior is expected or you may be asked to leave with additional discipline at school
- Adults may purchase a fall athletic pass for \$90
- Come out to support your classmates and show some school spirit!
- Athletic pass can be purchased tonight from Tricia Brown in the main office

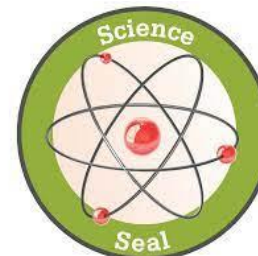

GRADES AND REPORTS

1. Student report cards are posted on Gradebook each nine weeks, which reports the record of achievement for the student **during that nine-week period of time only.**
2. The nine-week grade is expressed in terms of a letter grade for the purpose of figuring and reporting a semester or yearly grade.
3. The grading scales is as follows:

A	=	93 – 100
A-	=	90 – 92
B+	=	87 – 89
B	=	83 – 86
B-	=	80 – 82
C+	=	77 – 79
C	=	73 – 76
C-	=	70 – 72
D+	=	67 – 69
D	=	60 – 66
F	=	0 – 59

***The freshman year is the single most important year when establishing your high school GRADE POINT AVERAGE!**

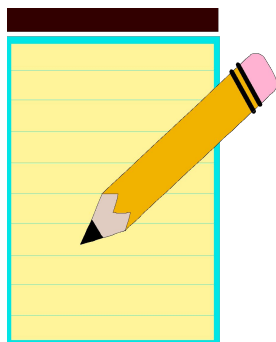

Students enrolled in AP courses are encouraged to take the AP exam for each course in May. Colleges can award college credit and/or advancement based on AP scores upon college enrollment.

Course Selection

(Minimum) College Entrance Recommendations

- **4 years of English**
- **4 years of Math**
- **3 - 4 years of Science**
(Including Biology, Chemistry, Physics)
- **3 - 4 years of Social Studies**
- **2 - 3 years of Foreign Language**
- **1 year of fine, applied or performing arts**



State of Ohio Honors Diploma

(Honors Diploma Seal)



Students must meet ***all but one*** of the following criteria:

- 4 credits of Math (including Algebra I, Algebra II, Geometry & one higher level)
- 4 credits of Science (including, 2 credits of advanced science)
- 4 credits of Social Studies
- 3 credits of Foreign Language **OR** 2 credits of two foreign languages
- 3.5 GPA on a 4.0 scale
- ACT: 27 or higher/SAT: 1280 or higher
- earn two additional diploma seals, not including Honors Diploma Seal
- Field experience, OhioMeansJobs Readiness seal, Portfolio or work-based learning

**Diploma with Honors, including: STEM, Fine Arts, Social Science
(see your counselor for criteria)**

Academic Letter

Qualifications:

- 3.800 weighted GPA for current academic year
- Earn points for participation in clubs, athletics
student needs to complete application in the
spring each year.
- Awarded at class meetings

Schedule Change Procedure

Schedule changes will be made **ONLY** for the following reasons:

- **Scheduling error** – ex: enrolled in Spanish II and did not take Spanish I yet
- **Summer school completion**
- Uneven balance of semester courses or study halls
- Be sure to take a picture of your schedule, so you will have it with you if it is lost

*If you feel you are in need of a schedule change,
a change form can be picked up in student services*
